# DISPLAY POLICY

The LA County Fair reserves the right to limit items for display to the facilities available. All entries will be on display. The Fair assumes total design control over the presentation of exhibits. The design staff shall determine location and placement of exhibits. No exhibit changes will be made after the items are on display.

All reasonable care will be taken in handling and displaying exhibits, but the LA County Fair assumes no responsibility for loss or damage whatsoever the cause. Submitting an exhibit implies acceptance of this rule. If insurance is desired, the exhibitor must carry it.

# **AWARDS**

- Ribbons will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners.
- Best of Division Rosette and \$100.00 premium awarded to one first place winner in each division.
- Best of Class Rosette and \$25.00 premium awarded to one first place winner in each class. (Only given if division has multiple classes.)
- These awards are granted at the discretion of the judges.

# JUDGING

The Danish System of Judging is used in Home Arts unless otherwise stated. The judging process is based upon established standards of quality for each type of product. In this system, each exhibit is judged according to how well it meets those standards rather than how it compares with the other exhibits. Judges shall avoid unnecessary fraternization with exhibitors. No person shall be allowed, under any circumstances, to interfere with the judge, or judges, during their adjudications, or with the Fair's staff, or to offer any criticism of any exhibit of another. No judging information will be given by telephone or mail. Results will be posted on our website after May 17, 2023. The judges may award first, second, third place, etc., according to merit. If without merit, the judges shall make no award under any circumstances. This rule applies whether there are one or more exhibits in the class. The judges decisions shall be final.

# ADULT DIVISION ENTRY RULES

- 1. Exhibitors are responsible for reading the competition information and rules and must abide by them.
- 2. There are no refunds of entry fee. See competition or contest for individual entry fee.
- 3. Once registration and payment has been received you will be sent an email confirmation. If you have not received the email confirmation please look in your spam/junk folder before contacting the LA County Fair.
- 4. You must be 18 years or older to enter, unless otherwise stated. If exhibitors are under 18 and would like to enter their projects at the fair, visit <a href="www.lacf.com/competitions">www.lacf.com/competitions</a> for information on Youth Home Arts Competitions.
- 5. Entries accepted from INDIVIDUALS ONLY, unless otherwise stated.
- 6. All entries entered must be the handiwork of the exhibitor. If, in the opinion of the Fair staff, an item had previously been entered, the Fair reserves the right to withhold the item from judging and display. Items can only be entered in the LA County Fair once.
- 7. Only items listed and described on the entry form will be accepted for judging.
- 8. Judges and/or Fair staff may reassign entries to a more appropriate division and/or class.
- 9. Delivery of all entries is on Saturday, March 11, 2023 from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. only. If you are unable to drop off your entry at this time you may send someone in your place or mail your item. All mailed entries must arrive by 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, March 9, 2023.
- 10. Fairplex will not be responsible for returning display hardware i.e. hangers, etc.
- 11. Entries that are stained, soiled or showing obvious signs of wear or use will be disqualified. Entries must be finished and no incomplete work will be accepted. Fair reserves the right to reject any exhibit or entry, if there is anything questionable, unsuitable, obscene, or requires more space than can be given, or is in conflict with exhibit requirements.
- 12. All entries must not exceed 25 pounds, have sturdy hardware and be ready to hang. Items designed for hanging that are not so-equipped will be displayed in a manner deemed appropriate by the Fair. If you have an entry that is large in scale please contact the Competition Coordinator to verify we can accept the entry.
- 13. In classes calling for "any, specify" or "other than listed, specify" be sure to indicate on the entry form the type of item being entered.
- 14. Identification tags will be issued for all items entered and exhibitors will be given a claim check for each item.
- 15. Although reasonable efforts are taken to safeguard the exhibitor's property against loss, damage, or theft, neither the Fairplex nor the LA County Fair are responsible for any loss, damage or theft of exhibitor's property brought on the premises during the period of the LA County Fair. Every precaution will be taken in the handling and exhibiting of entries.
- 16. Pick up of all entries is on Thursday, June 1, 2023 from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. only. Bring your claim checks with you. If your claim checks are lost, you must show photo identification before we will release your items. If you are unable to pick up your items you must send someone in your place. Please send them with your claim checks. If they do not have your claim checks, you must either call or email our office so we can put them on the item pick up list. The person picking up your items must have photo identification. If entries are not picked up then they will be donated to charity.
- 17. No person shall sign the entry form as an agent at the LA County Fair in any department if they are a manager, director, association member, department head, or paid employee.
- 18. The Los Angeles County Fair Association reserves the right to amend and add to these rules and empowers the Executive Committee with the final and absolute right to interpret all rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard thereto.



- 19. The LA County Fair pays premiums ONLY in those divisions and/or classes specifically listed. Premium checks will be mailed within ten (10) weeks following the close of the LA County Fair. The LA County Fair is not responsible for redemption of premiums.
- 20. Any exhibitor who wins over \$600.00 dollars or more in premiums or prizes must complete a W-9 form before checks are distributed in compliance with IRS regulations. A 1099 MISC will be issued to those exhibitors.

#### 21. MAIL RETURN INFORMATION:

- a. Exhibitors who send items to the Fair and wish to have them returned by mail must enclose a check for \$25.00 with their entry form and indicate that it is for a mail return.
- b. Items will be returned by June 30, 2023.
- c. Breakable, fragile or extremely heavy items will NOT be returned by mail; such items MUST be picked up.
- d. Size of the item must not exceed 130 inches in length and girth combined.
- e. Proper packaging materials MUST accompany all items that are to be shipped back.

# IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Crib Size: 50"x 40"

Twin Size: Typical size is 72"x 96" or smaller.

Full Size: Typical size is 81"x 96" or larger.

Wall Quilt: A quilt designed to hang on the wall.

Each side of Quilt is 60" or less.

# **HAND QUILTED**

## **Division 2345**

(Limit 10 entries per class)

#### Class 1 - Traditional Quilt, Any, specify

Pieced, hand-quilted – Based on well-established or customary design. *Includes: crib size, twin size, full size, and wall quilt.* 

## Class 2 - Miniature Quilt, Any, specify

Hand-quilted – Each side of the quilt is 18" or less. A miniature quilt is typically a very small version of a bed-size quilt. *Includes: pieced, appliqué, & mixed technique*.

## Class 3 - Mixed Technique, Any, specify

Hand-quilted – A combination of two (2) techniques, 50% of each technique. If more than two (2) techniques are used, each technique should be equal. *Includes: crib size, twin size, full size, and wall quilt.* 

# Class 4 - Hand & Machine Appliqué, Any, specify

Hand-quilted. Includes: crib size, twin size, full size, and wall quilt.

#### Class 5 - Embroidered Hand-Quilted, Any, specify

Hand-quilted. Includes: crib size, twin size, full size, and wall quilt.

# **Division 2346**

(Limit 10 entries per class)

# Class 1 - Traditional Quilt, Any, specify

Pieced, machine-quilted – If a long arm machine was used for finishing, please see long arm technique division. *Includes: crib size, twin size, full size, and wall quilt.* 

## Class 2 - Miniature Quilt, Any, specify

Machine-quilted – If a long arm machine was used for finishing, please see long arm technique division. Each side of the quilt is 18" or less. A miniature quilt is typically a very small version of a bed-size quilt. *Includes: pieced, appliqué, & mixed technique*.

#### Class 3 - Mixed Technique, Any, specify

Machine-quilted – If a long arm machine was used for finishing, please see long arm technique division. A combination of two (2) techniques, 50% of each technique. If more than two (2) techniques are used, each technique should be equal. *Includes: crib size, twin size, full size, and wall quilt*.

#### Class 4 - Hand & Machine Appliqué, Any, specify

Machine-quilted. – If a long arm machine was used for finishing, please see long arm technique division. *Includes: crib size, twin size, full size, and wall quilt.* 

#### Class 5 - Embroidered Machine-Quilted, Any, specify

Machine-quilted. Includes: crib size, twin size, full size, and wall quilt.

# LONG ARM TECHNIQUE

#### **Division 2347**

(Limit 10 entries per class)

#### Class 1 - Long Arm Technique, Any size

Self-quilted – A long arm machine was used and you did the work yourself.

#### Class 2 - Long Arm Technique, Any size

Professionally-quilted – You made the top quilt and had your quilt professionally quilted.

# **RULES**

- Make a quilt block using any technique or pattern of your choice.
- Blocks must measure 12 ½" square (raw edge to raw edge ready to be set in quilt). Finished size 12" by 12".
- Fabric must be 100% cotton.
- Blocks must NOT be quilted.
- Contest is open to all professional and amateur quilters.
- A 4" x 6" photo must be included with all quilt block entries. Please put your name on the back of the photo.
- Do not include your photo with your entry form. Photo needs to accompany the quilt block either day of take-in or be mailed with quilt block.
- All photos will be displayed unless the quilt block is displayed.
- All exhibitors will receive participant ribbons.
- Photos will not be returned to entrants.
- All ribbons will be mailed.
