General Livestock Rules

1. All 2022 State Rules for California Fairs set forth by the California Department of Food & Agriculture, Division of Fairs and Expositions apply. 2022 State rulebooks are available at: https://www.cdfa.ca.gov/FairsAndExpositions/Documents/Circular_Letters/2022/2022_State_Rules.pdf
2. All livestock entries must be completed online at www.LACountyFair.com/Competitions by end of day April 7, 2023. Preregistration is required for all entries; no late entries accepted. All fees must be paid online, no checks accepted.
3. YOUTH: As of January 1, 2019, Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) training is required for all youth livestock exhibitors. For more information and to sign-up visit <http://yqca.org/>. NEW: YQCA certificates no longer need to be submitted to the Livestock Office; instead, staff will verify completion via the YQCA system. The exhibitor's first and last name must EXACTLY match the name entered in ShoWorks for their entries to be verified.
4. All entries must remain on display at the LA County Fair as mandated by the dates set forth in the Livestock Competition Guide. Any entry removed prior to the release date and time, unless consent is granted by LA County Fair Management due to extenuating circumstances, shall be disqualified from any and all competitions and premiums are therefore forfeited.
5. Youth exhibitors can enter only project units in which they are currently enrolled if they are to be affiliated with the youth organization.
6. There is no limit on entries except as noted under the department headings. There is a limit of two cash awards per exhibitor per class.
7. Exhibitors are eligible to compete/exhibit through December 31 of the year in which they turn 19 years of age in the Youth Division, all others must enter Open.
8. Exhibitor's age as of May 5, 2023 (opening day of the LA County Fair) must be specified on entry.
9. Breeding animals must be owned by the exhibitor 30 days prior to the opening day of the LA County Fair (purchased by 4/5/23) unless specified under specie rules.
10. Exhibitors are required to maintain clean barn and stall areas. All areas must be ready for inspection by 8 a.m. each day.
 - a. All exhibits not properly maintained may be cause for dismissal from the fairgrounds and forfeit premiums.
 - b. All stalls MUST be cleaned upon departure.
11. Exhibitors are requested not to move animals unnecessarily, only to and from wash rack, tie rails and show ring. Exhibitors must clean up after themselves and their animals. No animal is allowed to leave

the designated livestock area without permission of the Livestock Program Supervisor. Any flagrant disregard of this rule could result in being barred from showing and/or forfeiture of premiums.

12. Adults (non-exhibitor/leader/advisor/teacher/parents) are NOT allowed to assist in the fitting of animals for the LA County Fair Youth Shows. (Fitting livestock is defined as preparing animal for the show including, but not limited to, washing, blow drying, clipping, brushing or trimming.) Livestock leaders and advisors may assist with the feeding and watering of animals. For the safety of all exhibitors and the public, adults may assist exhibitors and their animals to the scale, wash racks and show ring.

13. After the close of entries, Fair Management reserves the right to combine classes and/or divisions if sufficient entries are not received. This combination will be made after papers are checked, in order to have an accurate number of entries. Fair Management reserves the right to cancel any classes or divisions due to lack of entries.

14. The Livestock Department reserves the right to limit entries to facilities available, when necessary.

15. The LA County Fair Livestock Department will have exclusive jurisdiction as to how many animals to a pen and assignment of pens.

16. Vehicles may NOT be left unattended and must be removed from grounds after unloading. Violators will be ticketed and/or towed.

17. Livestock shall remain in the care, custody and control of the entrant. The entrant shall indemnify and hold harmless the LA County Fair & Fairplex and the LA County Fair & Fairplex's Board of Directors, the LA County Fair Association, its employees, officers, agents or representatives for any injury, property damage and any real, incidental, or consequential damages resulting from the livestock or caused by the livestock. The LA County Fair & Fairplex will not be responsible for any loss or damage caused by or arising out of strikes, riots, lockouts or natural disasters.

18. All livestock entries are made with the distinct understanding that in no event will the LA County Fair or Fairplex become responsible for any loss or damage that may occur to any livestock animal. Presentation of the entry shall be deemed acceptance of this rule.

19. There will be NO REFUNDS OF PROCESSING FEES, either for overpayment, duplicate entries, not showing or failure to bring in the entry.

20. ALL EXHIBITORS are required to only use equipment that is properly grounded and meets UL specifications (i.e. clippers, blowers, heaters, vacuums, fans, etc.).

21. For the safety of exhibitors and the public, no food or drinks will be allowed in the Livestock Area.

22. SECURITY – Exhibitors are cautioned to keep equipment stored where it will not be lost or stolen. The LA County Fair & Fairplex accepts no responsibility for any equipment.

23. Exhibitors are encouraged to have Educational Displays to enhance the educational value of visiting the LA County Fair and exemplify the high caliber of the individuals participating in livestock shows, their animal projects and the agriculture industry in Los Angeles County.

24. Only animals entered in LA County Fair livestock competitions are allowed on LA County Fair & Fairplex property except at the discretion of the Livestock Supervisor.

25. Exhibitors are NOT allowed to sell feed and/or items of any kind, nor solicit donations.

26. No "FOR SALE" signs will be allowed on cages or in show areas. The selling of animals on fair property is not permitted and the LA County Fair is not responsible for the sale of any animals at the fair.

27. The American system of Judging will be used for all competitions.

28. The Judge's decision shall be final.

29. Violation of any of the above rules may result in disqualification.

Policies for the Care & Treatment of Animals

1. Fair management reserves the right to require health inspections and/or diagnostic tests to be made before, during or after animals are on the fairgrounds and to implement disease control procedures which may become necessary in emergencies. The health of animals as determined by an official Fair veterinarian or by the judge shall be final and CANNOT be protested. Exhibitors who refuse to allow their animals to be examined shall be disqualified, animals will be removed from the fairgrounds and such violations shall be reported to Fair & Expositions. No refunds will be granted.

2. Animals entered will be inspected by the official Fair veterinarian.

3. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to feed, water and care for any animal they have entered in the Fair for the entire show through departure.

4. All large livestock exhibitors must supply their own feed and water receptacles. No pressurized water systems in any pens/cages are allowed.

5. No filling or feeding of animals by artificial means will be allowed including the use of tubes or drench guns.

6. Unruly animals will be removed at the discretion of the Farm Competitions Coordinator.

7. Any alteration of appearance, physical change by removal or injection, including the use of paint, powder, dye, shoe polish, glue or artificial color is strictly prohibited.

8. Health certificate, where required, must be presented upon arrival at the LA County Fair. Please refer to the Animal Health Rules and State Rules.

Youth Guidelines & Uniform Standards

The Youth Department is for qualifying individuals who want to enter the LA County Fair. The LA County Fair has established divisions and classes for groups such as FFA, 4-H clubs and the like to provide opportunities for young people to exhibit who are not members of an organization in several ways, such as allowing them to compete in the appropriate class in direct competition with an organization member if there are very few “independent youth”.

In a livestock class, the Independent must meet the same age requirements as the direct competition members of an organization.

FFA MEMBERS may participate in classes if they are enrolled in high school agriculture classes and are active, dues paying members of their FFA chapter. Active FFA members may exhibit projects until the end of the next calendar year following graduation.

4-H / GRANGE MEMBERSHIP enrollment is open to all youth from kindergarten through grade 12 through December 31 of the year in which they turn 19 years of age.

4-H PRIMARY members must be 5 years old or in kindergarten by January 1 of the program year. Primary members cannot enroll in large animal projects. Approved animal projects are dogs, rabbits, rats, cats, poultry, cavies, mice, embryology, entomology, marine science, pygmy goats, and therapeutic animal projects. (Youth enrolling or turning 9 after January 1 must participate as a Primary Member until the end of the program year.)

INDEPENDENT & OTHER YOUTH EXHIBITORS not affiliated with any organization may enter appropriate FFA and 4-H classes if they meet the required age or grade level. Fair management may establish separate classes if there are sufficient entries. Independent youth exhibitors must not have been enrolled in a junior organization within 60 days to be eligible to participate. Exhibitors are eligible to compete/exhibit through December 31st of the year in which they turn 19 years of age. Each entry in these divisions must have been made or produced by the exhibitor. Entries shall be made on Youth Department entry forms provided by the Fair. The signature of the parent or guardian is required. Exhibitors who are enrolled in any junior organization for which classes are offered elsewhere are not eligible to enter these divisions.

UNIFORM: All National FFA Organization and 4-H Club and Grange exhibitors must wear the official uniform of their organization while showing. FFA uniforms are to be worn by all FFA exhibitors and by helpers in individual and chapter groups while showing at the LA County Fair Livestock Department shows. The official uniforms are as follows:

- **FFA Uniform:** Dark blue, black or white pants, white shirt, FFA tie and official FFA jacket (zipped to the top) or FFA patch attached to the white shirt.
- **4-H Uniform:** Dark blue, black or white pants, white collared shirt (any sleeve length), and 4-H Club cap (4-H tie or scarf is optional).
- **Grange Uniform:** White collared button-down shirt, dark blue jeans and red vest with Grange emblem on the back.
- **Independent Uniform:** Dark blue, black or white pants and white collared shirt.

- **Open Exhibitor Uniform:** Clean white top, show whites or team uniform.

NO attendant or other person will be allowed in the show ring unless neatly dressed in proper uniform.

IAFE (INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS) **CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS**

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

- 1)** All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership, and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
- 2)** Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
- 3)** Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
- 4)** Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of, consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the

sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the laboratory, to which it is sent, is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

5) Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.

6) The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

7) Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

8) No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.

9) The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.

10) The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including *Fairs and Expos* and any special notices to members.

11) The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE Code of Show

Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

Poultry

General Poultry Rules

1. For information on arrival and departure, refer to the timetable on page 2.
2. This show is sanctioned by the American Poultry Association, Inc. Rules, definitions and judging procedures as prescribed in the latest edition of the Official Show Rules and the Standard of Perfection of the American Poultry Association, Inc., shall apply to all district and county fair poultry shows, except in instances where they conflict with the rules and regulations prescribed by the Department of Food and Agriculture.
3. BOTH youth and adult exhibitors can enter in the open division since no youth divisions are offered.
4. Only animals entered in the show are allowed on the LA County Fair property.
5. All birds must be identified by a **legible** leg band conforming to the entry form upon arrival at the show.
6. Poultry Health Inspection – All exhibitors shall have their poultry inspected upon arrival at the LA County Fair prior to coop-in for symptoms of disease or illness. Poultry not passing inspection must be removed from the premises immediately by the owner or housed in a fair designated quarantine area. Poultry must have a leg band to be inspected. Upon passing inspection, any birds without leg bands are required to purchase temporary leg bands for \$5 from the Livestock Office. Exhibitors who do not arrive and have their birds inspected are conducted cannot make any other arrangements for a future inspection and will be ineligible to show.
7. The judge may excuse a bird from competition if it appears to be fatigued or out of condition, but the birds will be counted as an entry.
8. Exhibitors must list the breed, variety, leg band number, division and class number of each bird on the entry form.
9. Birds will be shown and judged in the proper division and class for breed, variety, age and sex only if no class is offered, no awards will be made.
10. Violation of any of the above rules may result in disqualification.
11. ****All youth entering **Youth Poultry Showmanship** must have the bird used for showmanship entered in the breed competition as well.*

1. For information on the arrival, please refer to the timetable on page 2.
2. Exhibitor must own the hen that produced the eggs.
3. One entry per class per hen.
4. Each entry must contain six eggs, all from the same hen. Eggs must be placed in an egg carton.
5. Exhibitors must submit a clear, colored photo of the hen that laid the eggs at delivery. Photo must be no smaller than 4 inches by 6 inches and no larger than 8.5 inches by 11 inches.
6. Containers and eggs of great sentimental value should not be entered as containers and eggs will not be returned. Entries become property of the LA County Fair.
7. Judge may candle eggs.

1. Rules, definitions and judging procedures as prescribed in the current Guide Book and Standard of the ARBA, Inc., shall apply to all district and county fair rabbit shows, provided they do not conflict with any of the rules and regulations prescribed by the Dept. of Food and Agriculture.
2. Only animals entered in the show are allowed on the LA County Fairgrounds.
3. All animals must be identifiable by a legible, permanent ear marking in the left ear conforming to the entry form upon arrival at the show. Any duplication of ear markings by one exhibitor in the same division must be eliminated and changes must be recorded on the judging sheet before judging.
4. Entries will be separated into divisions and classes based on breed and classes entered once entries close. Animals will be shown and judged in the proper division and class for breed, variety, age and sex only. If no division is offered, no awards may be made.
5. Entries may be sent without ear numbers with the understanding that correct ear numbers MUST be called in. substitutions may also be made only in the same breed as the original entry. Changes or updates must be faxed or mailed no later than Friday, July 29.
6. Exhibitors may enter no more than four rabbits in each class.
7. Entries shall be limited to facilities available. Entries will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. Entry forms and fees shall be returned when capacity of department has been reached.
8. All Other Purebred Divisions of Heavyweight and Lightweight Breeds will apply to all standard breeds as prescribed by the current ARBA Standard Book. There are no crossbred classes.
9. Rabbit “working breeds” NOT recognized by ARBA as of July 1, 2022, will be evaluated by the judge providing the exhibitor supplies the working standard. Working breeds entered are NOT eligible for premiums and/or Best of Show. Variety of working breed must be specified on entry form.
10. No “FOR SALE” signs allowed on cages or in show areas. The selling of animals is not permitted. The OC Fair is not responsible for any animals sold at the Fair.
11. Violation of any of the above rules may result in disqualification.

4. ILR-SD requires a \$3 fee per animal entered (example: if you have three llamas entered, the fee is \$9). This fee is due at the time of check-in, payable to ILR-SD, only cash or check accepted.
5. Original International Llama Registry (ILR) certificates required at check-in.
6. Owner/exhibitor information must match entry and registration paperwork.
7. Llamas may be shown in youth or adult performance classes.
8. In Youth Divs., exhibitors shall show only one llama, but more than 1 youth exhibitor can show the same llama.
9. If there are less than six entries in any two youth divisions the youth divisions may be combined.
10. Pens are typically 8-by-8 feet and 4 feet high. Space is limited. Limited self-penning space will be available.
11. All llamas shall be presented for judging with a halter and lead rope and no additional decorations, including but not limited to: tassels, pompoms or other removable decorations.
12. Crias may not accompany nursing alpaca or llama mothers, it is recommended not to show nursing mothers.
