- Ribbons will be awarded to 1st. 2nd and 3rd place winners.
- Best of Division Rosette and \$100.00 premium awarded to one first place winner in each division.
- Best of Class Rosette and \$25.00 premium awarded to one first place winner in each class. (Only given if division has multiple classes.)
- Blue Ribbon Sweepstakes and \$100.00 premium awarded to the exhibitor winning the most blue ribbons in divisions 2205-2265.
- These awards are granted at the discretion of the judges.
- Ribbons will be mailed to exhibitors by July 31st.
- Premium checks will be mailed within ten (10) weeks following the close of the LA County Fair.

## JUDGING

The American System of Judging is used in the Home Arts building/ Culinary Kitchen, unless otherwise stated. The judging process ranks exhibits against one another and gives awards to first place, second Judges shall place, etc. avoid fraternization with unnecessary exhibitors. No person shall be allowed, under any circumstances, to interfere with the judge, or judges, during their adjudications, or with the Fair's staff, or to offer any criticism of any exhibit of another. Violators of this rule shall be excluded immediately from the judging area. information will be given No bv telephone, email or mail. Results will be posted on our website after May 17, 2024. The judges may award first, second, third place, etc., according to merit. If without merit, the iudaes shall make no award under any rule applies cicumstances. This whether there are one or more exhibits in the class. The judges decisions shall be final.

## DISPLAY POLIC

The LA County Fair reserves the right to limit items for display to the facilities available. All award-winning entries will be on display. The Fair assumes total design control over the presentation of exhibits. The design staff shall determine location and placement of exhibits. No exhibit changes will be made after the items are on display.

# INDUSTRY PROFESSIONAL

An individual who is trained to understand flavors, cooking techniques, create recipes from scratch with fresh ingredients, and have a high level of *paid* responsibility within the industry. Bakers, Chefs, and others who are paid in the industry or selling food for a profit are professionals.

# ADULT DIVISION BAKED FOOD & CONFECTIONS ENTRY RULES

- 1. Exhibitors are responsible for reading the competition information, individual rules for each competition, general entry rules and must abide by them.
- 2. There are no refunds of entry fee. See competition or contest for individual entry fee.
- 3. Please print out your online entry receipt for your records.
- Adult amateurs only (18 years of age and older). If exhibitors are under 18 and would like to enter their entries at the fair, visit <u>www.lacountyfair.com/competitions</u> for information on Youth Culinary Competitions.
- 5. Amateur A person who engages in an event or activity as a pastime rather than a profession. Instructors, professionals, or those who make a practice of selling their handicraft are not eligible to enter for competition. Teachers, judges, professional cooks, caterers, chefs, cake decorators, or those who commercialize their work are not eligible in the Baked Foods and Confections competitions. The only exception is the Industry Professional Competition Division 2265.
- 6. Entries accepted from INDIVIDUALS ONLY.
- 7. Limit of one entry per class (to enter more in one class would be, in effect, competing against oneself).
- 8. Items will be judged in Division and Class entered by exhibitors. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to correctly classify their items. Only items listed and described on entry form will be accepted for judging.
- 9. Entries must be the work of the exhibitor in whose name they were entered.
- 10. In classes calling for "any, specify" or "other than listed, specify" be sure to indicate on the entry form the type of item being entered.
- 11. Judges and/or Fair staff may reassign entries to a more appropriate division and/or class.
- 12. Delivery of all entries is on Monday, April 22, 2024 from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. only. If you are unable to drop off your entry at this time you may send someone in your place.
- 13. A typed or computer printed **measured ingredients list** on an 8 ½" x 11" sheet including name, address, phone number, division, and class number is **required with every entry** (any entry that arrives without the required measured ingredients list and information will **NOT** be accepted for judging). **The measured ingredients list is due with item on delivery day.**
- 14. All measured ingredients lists submitted will become the property of the Los Angeles County Fair Association and may be published, reproduced, developed, and sold by the Los Angeles County Fair Association. When appropriate, credit will be given to the originator of the measured ingredients list.



# ADULT DIVISION BAKED FOOD & CONFECTIONS ENTRY RULES

- 15. Deliver cakes on wax paper and cardboard, which should extend slightly beyond base of cake. **DO NOT USE CHINA OR GLASS PLATES AS THESE ITEMS WILL NOT BE RETURNED**. If board is used as a foundation for decorated cake, have hole in center front to attach identification tag. Cake boxes are also acceptable.
- 16. Deliver all cookies, breads, confections etc. on paper plates, in zip top bags, or wrapped in a plastic wrap or foil depending on your entry. Cake or pastry boxes are also acceptable. **Do not bring your entry in Tupperware or on plates, as we will not be responsible for the return of those items.**
- 17. Baked Foods must be homemade (no mixes, unless otherwise specified), named, original, unpublished and the sole property of entrant.
- 18. **Cakes will not be refrigerated.** Therefore, items that require refrigeration (i.e. fresh fruit or cheesecake) will not be accepted for judging; these items will be disqualified.
- 19. Entries made with a bread machine are unacceptable unless otherwise specified.
- 20. ALL BAKED FOODS will become the property of the LA County Fair, and will not be returned, no exceptions.
- 21. NO baked items will be shipped back to the exhibitor.
- 22. The LA County Fair reserves the right to reject anything that is entered into a contest or competition at the Fair that may be objectionable, unsuitable, requires more space than can be given, or conflicts with exhibit requirements.
- 23. No person shall sign the entry form as an agent at the LA County Fair in any department if they are a manager, director, association member, department head, or paid employee.
- 24. The Los Angeles County Fair Association reserves the right to amend and add to these rules and empowers the Executive Committee with the final and absolute right to interpret all rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regard thereto.
- 25. The LA County Fair pays premiums ONLY in those classes specifically listed. **Premium checks will be mailed within ten (10) weeks following the close of the LA County Fair.** The LA County Fair is not responsible for redemption of premiums.
- 26. Any exhibitor who wins over \$600.00 dollars or more in premiums or prizes must complete a W-9 form before checks are distributed in compliance with IRS regulations. A 1099 MISC will be issued to those exhibitors.
- 27. Baked Foods & Confections ribbons will be mailed to exhibitors by July 31st.
